The magical effect of the first technologies

In 1880, Rodrigo Sánchez-Arjona installed two
Gower Bell telephones —
previously purchased in
Paris — in Fregenal de la
Sierra (Badajoz, Spain) to
communicate his house in
the village with his estate
in the countryside, 8 kilometres away. As a result,
the installation became the
first rural telephone line
in Spain, and its developer, one of the pioneers in
the use of the telephone.

Sánchez-Arjona — known as "the Wizard" among his neighbours, who saw his love of technology as magic — had a passion for science and the technological effervescence of his time. He was a true forerunner who embraced new technologies without hesitation, long before they were accepted by society in everyday use.
